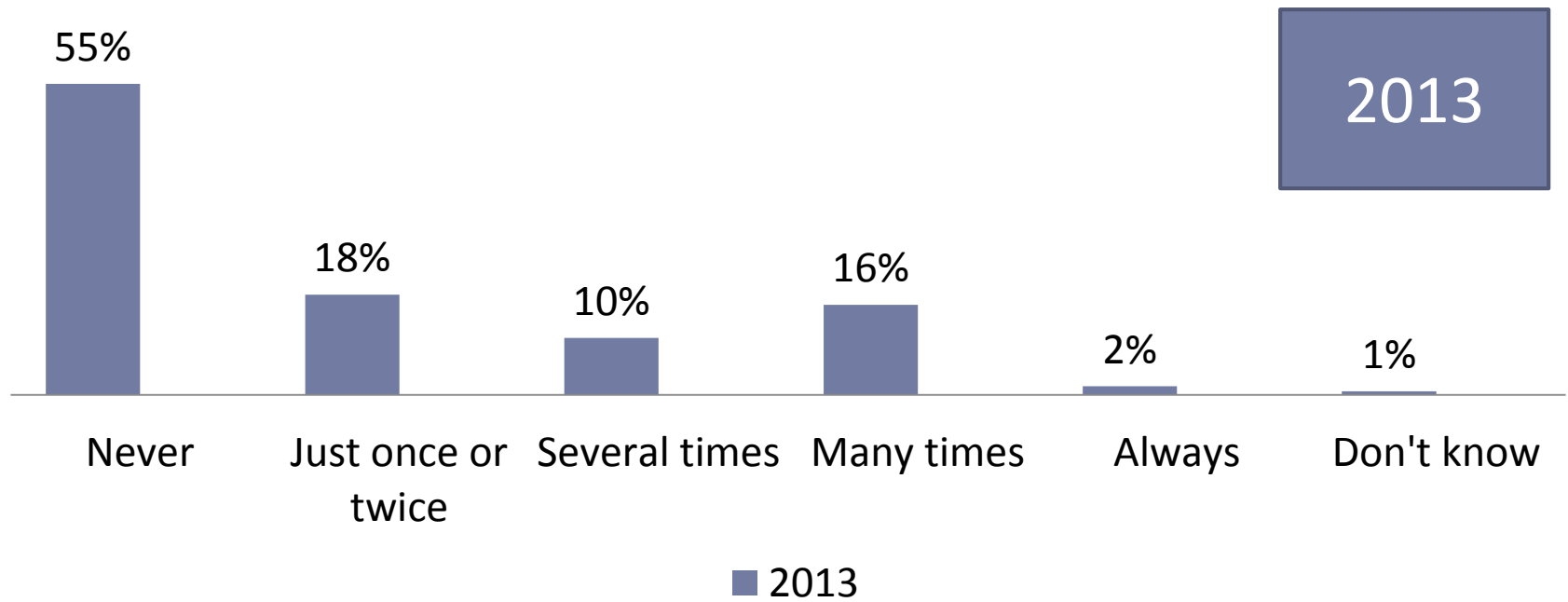

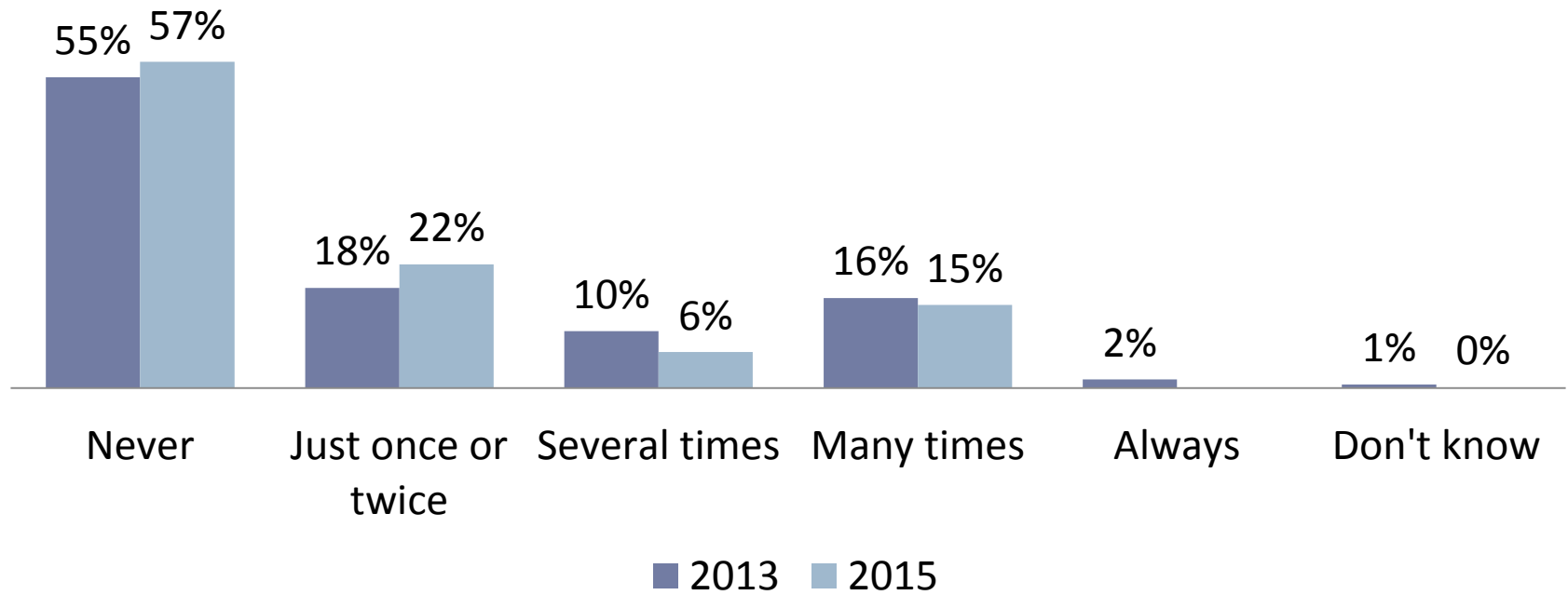
Fact 1: Eight out of ten citizens feel safe in their neighbourhoods

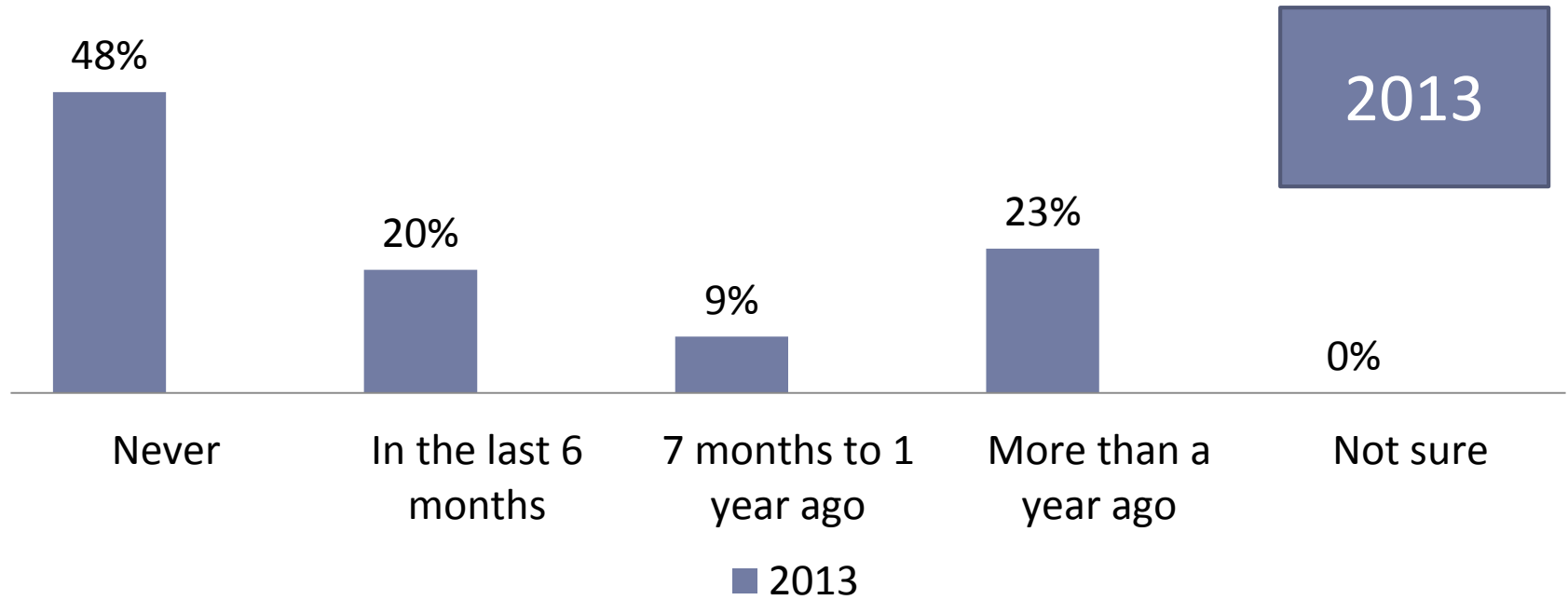

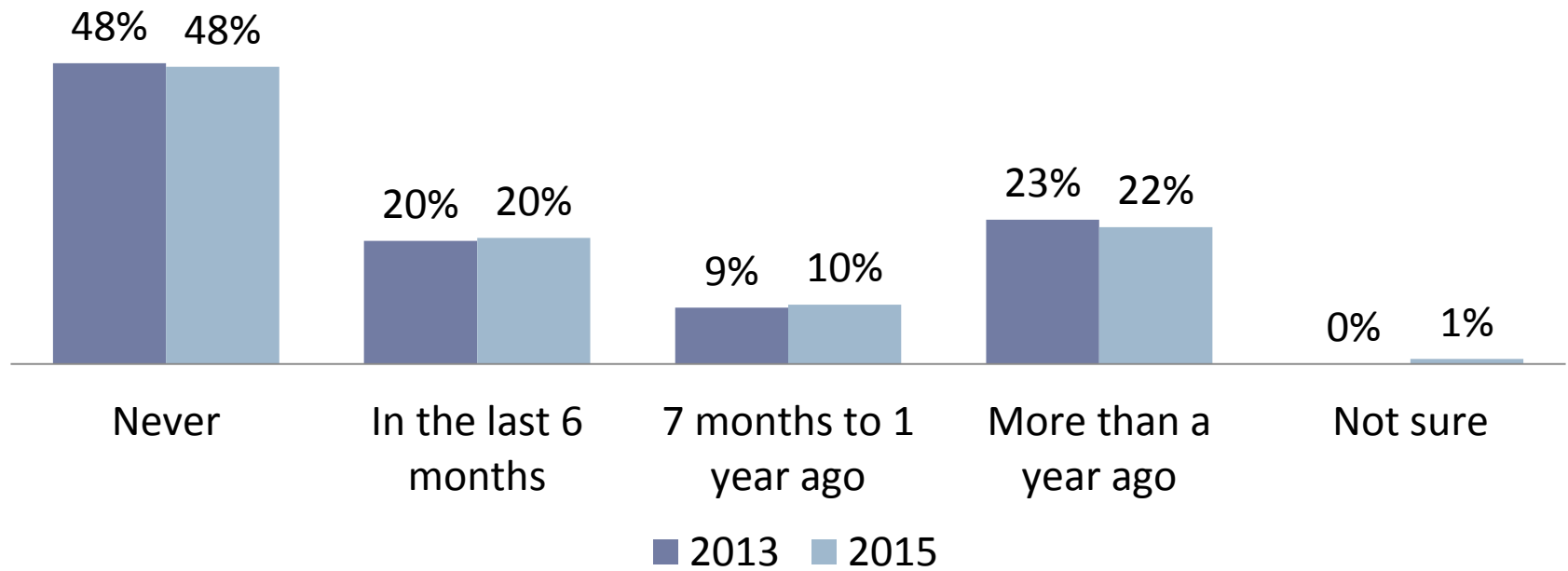
Fact 2: Half of the citizens have experienced theft, three out of ten in the past year

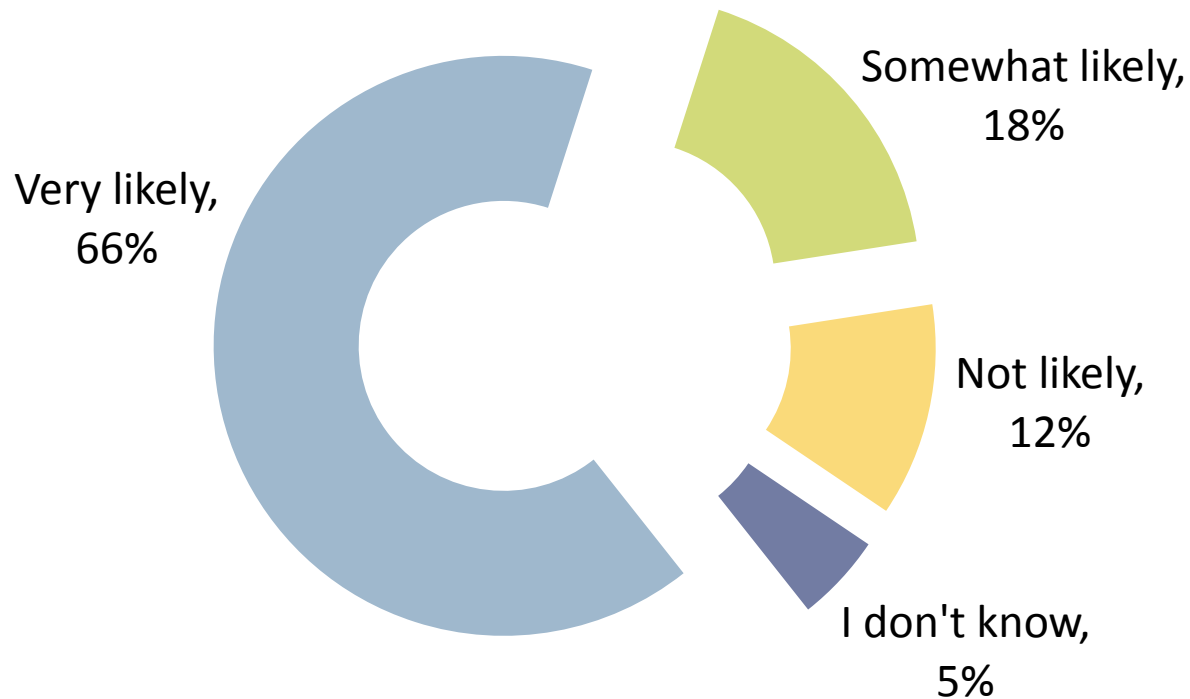

How likely do you think it is that you will be affected by a group like Panya Road?

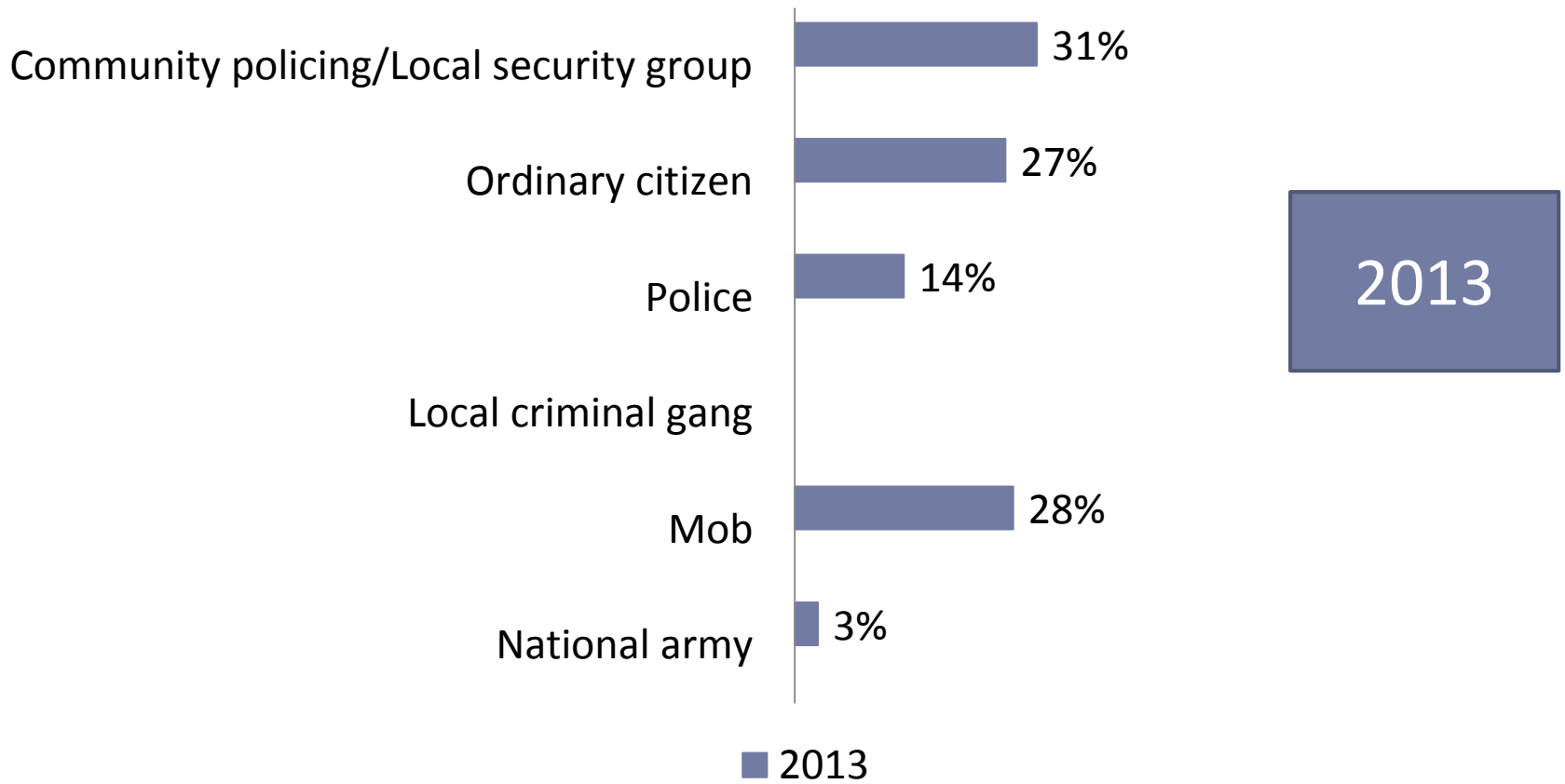

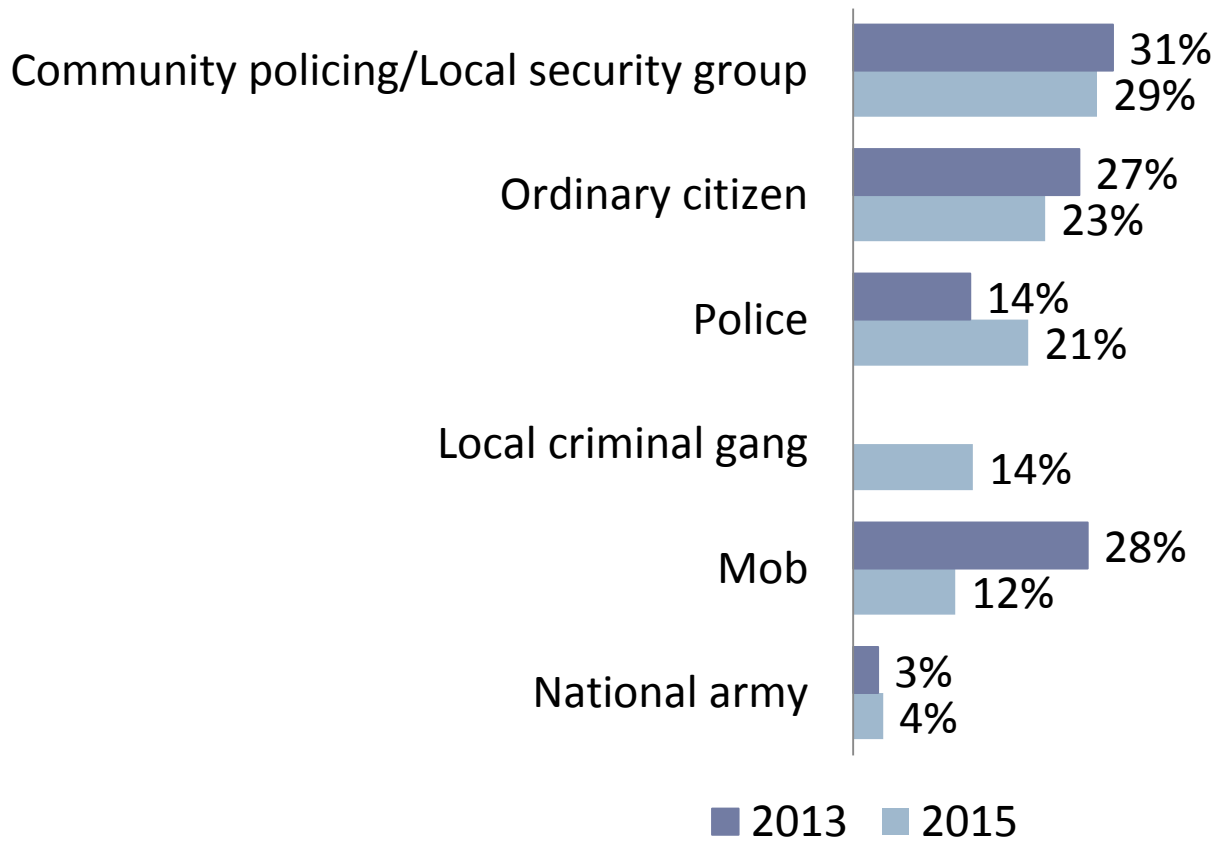
Fact 4: Community security groups are most likely to perpetrate violence

Incidence of threats, beatings and stoning perpetrated by different groups in the past year



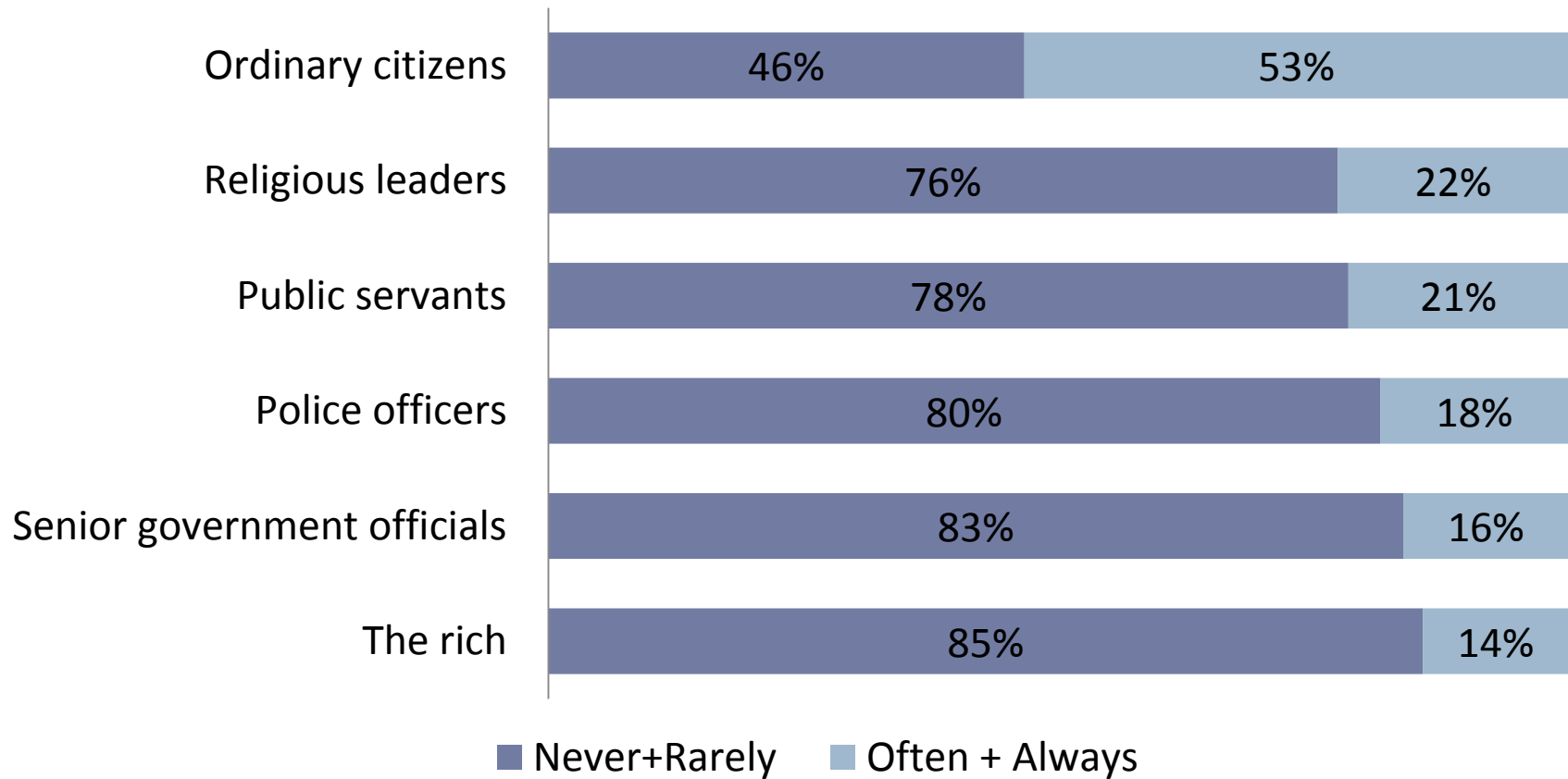

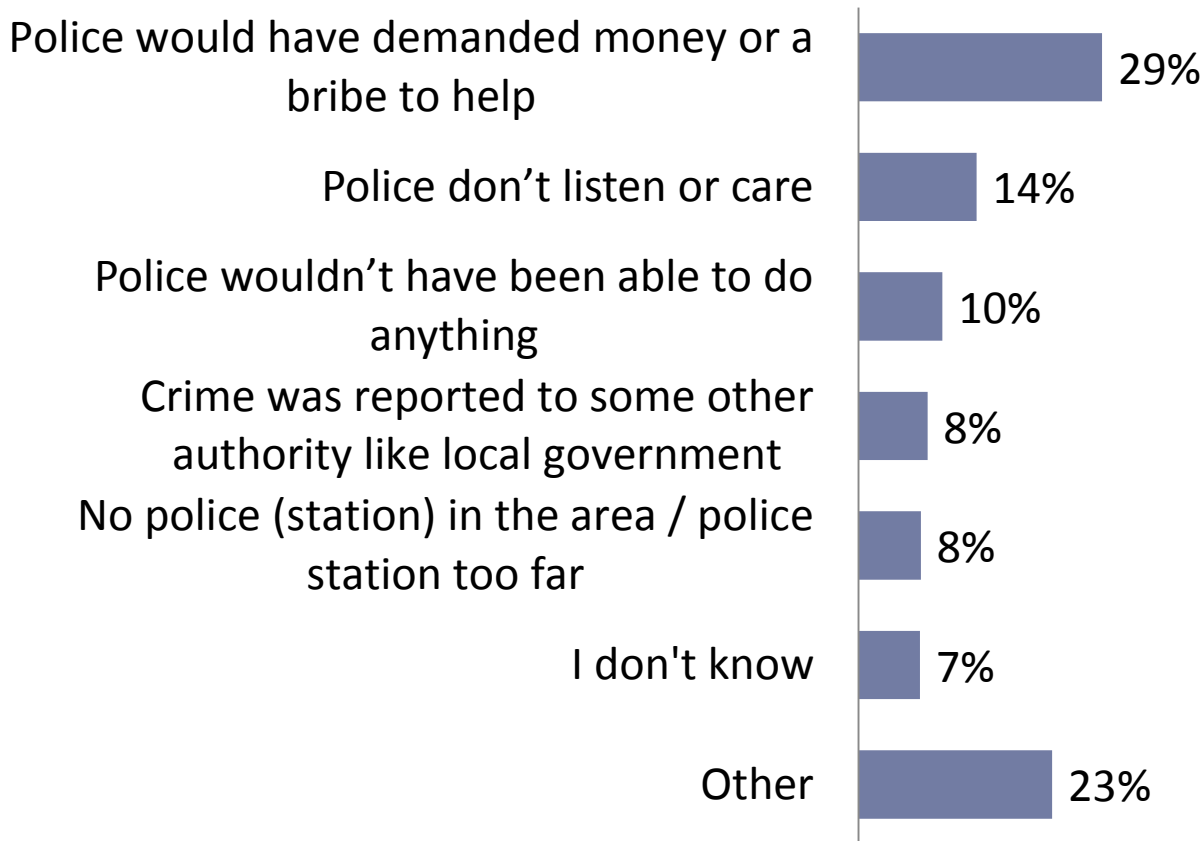
Fact 5: Citizens believe the justice system is biased

What do you think is the main reason that people do not report crimes to the police?

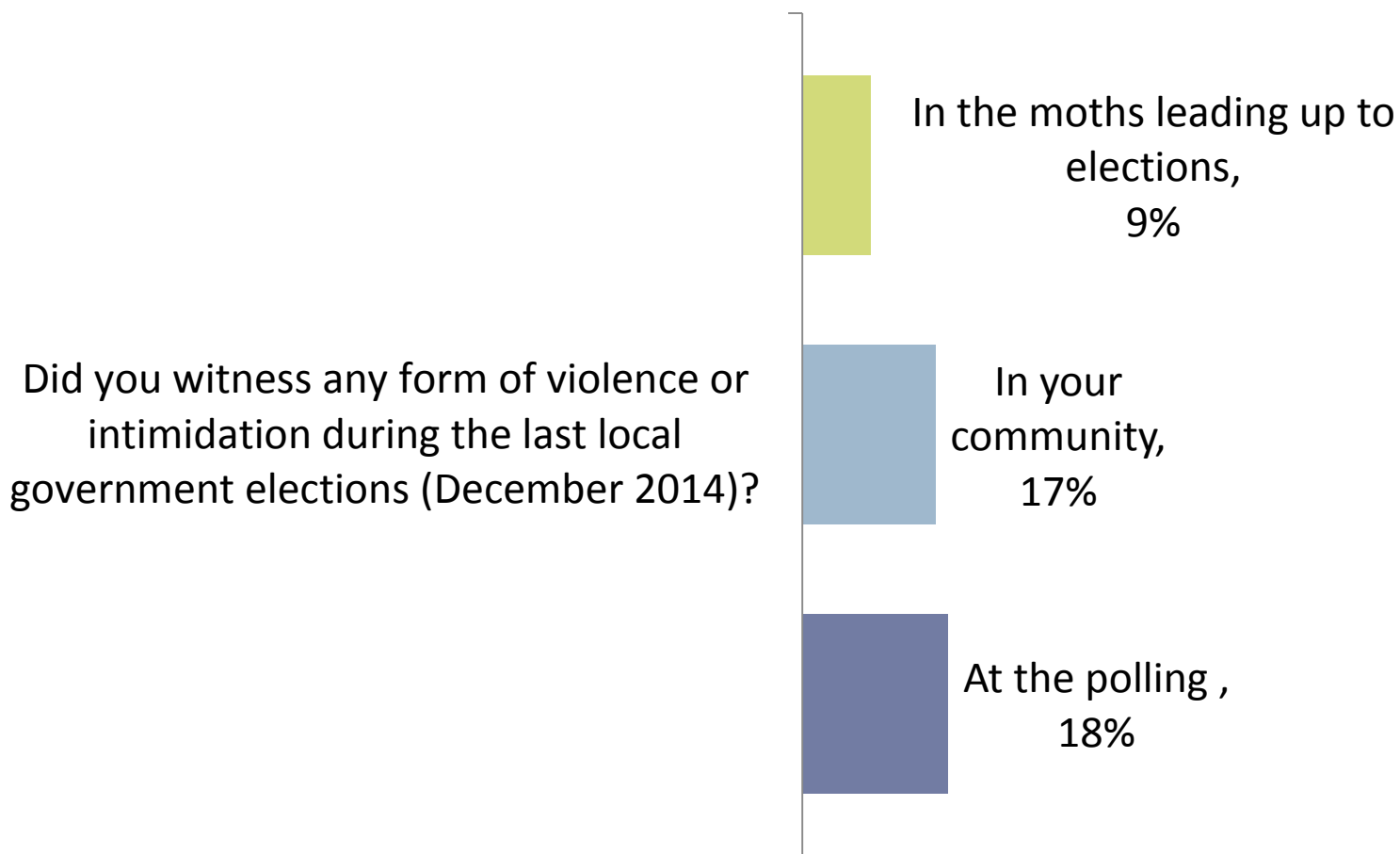
